## Nissaba

A quality option offering drilling flexibility and robust performance



Nissaba offers a wide drilling window from early October through to the end of April. Breeder trials evaluating October sowings across three seasons have shown yield averages equal to KWS Zyatt and marginally better than Skyfall.

A relatively late maturing variety, it has a similar height (77 cm) to Mulika and as a Group 1 spring-drilled option, shows equivalent performance, with some field trials noting a 10% treated yield improvement against Mulika.

The variety has high resistance to brown rust and is resistant to orange wheat blossom midge. It also offers robust resistance to Septoria tritici (6) and although Nissaba can be weaker against mildew (5) and yellow rust (5), it tends to be affected later in the season. Trial observations show this wheat did not develop the characteristic yellow pustules through the winter months, when the pathogen was visibly active on rival species.



Nissaba offers high Hagbergs and substantial grain protein levels. Its Gluten quality is good although a slight variation has been seen in the baking quality.
